We hereby acknowledge that Impian Tekad Sdn Bhd, was the Malaysian contractor undertaking the installation of 4 x 160 MW gas turbines and their auxiliaries & piping works, 2 x 160 MW steam turbines and their auxiliaries & piping works, and the Balance of Plant for the 2 x 480 MW at the Haifu Combined Cycle Power Plant in Taoyuan Country, Taiwan ROC.

Asea Brown Boveri Ltd. was awarded the EPC turnkey contract for a 960 MW gas fired combined cycle power plant project by Ever Power IPP Co. Ltd (Ever Power), an Independent Power Producer incorporated and resident in Taiwan R.O.C.

The contract encompassed the design, manufacture, supply, construction, commissioning and testing of two (2) blocks of plant. Each block comprises 2 gas turbines GT24, 2HRSG; 1 steam turbine, auxiliary equipment and the Balance of Plant.

ABB awarded the installation work for the Haifu project to their Taiwan contractor, Ho Power Engineering and Services (HPES), and their nominated sub-contractor Promto Sikojaya Sdn Bhd, a Malaysian incorporated company. Promto Sikojaya Sdn Bhd in turn sub-contracted the whole work to their associated company, Impian Tekad Sdn Bhd (Impian Tekad), also incorporated in Malaysia.

The work carried out by Impian Tekad was led by Mr. Wong Chok Vai (Passport No. A 8314311), the Project Director and Project Manager, and Mr. Chan Keng Kae (Passport No. A 8610613), the Site Manager.

Promto Sikojaya demonstrated high organizational and management skills in response to the high need for flexibility given the complexities of the project. At the height of the project, Impian Tekad had 323 staff on site, comprising 230 Malaysian, 90 Thai and 3 Taiwanese workers.
